Mexico's President Claudia Sheinbaum and U.S. President Donald Trump began their terms just months apart, both prioritizing the border. Sheinbaum highlights concerns over U.S. overreach, trade, and energy, while Trump's early actions—tariffs, migrant camps, and deportation crackdowns—signal an aggressive stance. This two day conference examines U.S.-Mexico relations through policies, people, and resources, featuring experts across four panels, a roundtable discussion with border city mayors, and a keynote from leading journalist, Maria Hinojosa.
