

Cincuenta películas en cinco días

El festival de LASA2022 tiene muchas y excelentes novedades. Dado que el encuentro se ha quedado sin presencialidad, hemos convertido esta dificultad en un beneficio para todos los asistentes al Congreso 2022. Las películas estarán disponibles durante cinco días (5 al 10 de mayo 2022), es decir, una vez finalizado el congreso los asistentes tendrán dos días más para visionar la excelente selección que propone este año el festival.

Por otra parte, y dado que gracias a esta extensión tenemos menos limitaciones de tiempo, el festival esta vez presenta 50 películas: 17 cortos y 33 largos; de ellos, siete largos y un corto son ficciones. Otra importante estadística de este festival es que más del 50% de las producciones que se presentan han sido dirigidas por mujeres. Las películas están ordenadas por orden alfabético en este catálogo, y todas están acompañadas por un encabezamiento con orientaciones temáticas y formales para el visionado, incluyendo la mención de las geografías narradas. Otra novedad que presenta esta edición del festival es que se indica en cada caso la información sobre distribución, de manera que las y los interesados puedan gestionar el alquiler o la compra de películas para sus cursos y/o sus instituciones.

Esta edición del festival ha reunido muestras de la enorme diversidad de formas comunicativas y propuestas que el lenguaje documental ha venido desarrollando: videoarte, animación, participatory video, found footage, video essay, Fulldome 360°, autobiografía, y producciones comunitarias, entre las que se destaca el cine indígena, documental y de ficción. Asimismo, varios de los filmes exhibidos están hablados en una lengua indígena. Las temáticas abordadas por estas cincuenta películas son múltiples y cubren un amplio espectro de las cuestiones más relevantes que ocupan la realidad y los debates latinoamericanos de hoy.

La información de este festival incluye la indicación de las películas premiadas con el LASA AWARD OF MERIT IN FILM, películas que se destacan por su lucidez y calidad formal. La proyección de las películas es exclusivamente ON DEMAND.





In an attempt to preserve fragments of a disappearing culture, Mateo walks across communities in the arid and desolate Paraguayan Chaco region, and registers on cassettes the experiences of other Ayoreo who, like him, were born in the vast forest, free and nomadic, without any contact with white civilization, until religious missionaries forced them to abandon their ancestral territory, their means of subsistence, their beliefs and their home.







The film explores manifold stories behind the meat industry in Argentina. Taking off from the personal narrative of Tata Moya, an ex-worker at a slaughtering facility in the Argentine pampas, this film opens the curtain on an industry socially designed to remain out of sight. Working against the common assumption of the slaughterhouse as a space designed to confine and conceal the violent encounter between butchers and cattle, the video delves into the complex cultural tales of a country known worldwide for its meat production and steak culture. What if meat isn't separated from cattle? What if humans and animals are part of the same overarching narrative? By looking at disparate stories surrounding cattle and meat, the film speculates about modes of kinship with other species as co-habitants of our world in the making of a common history.







Synopsis

The film serves as a grave warning of how far government control of women's bodies can go. El Salvador is a country with some of the most restrictive abortion laws in the world, including the criminalization of those who experience miscarriages and other obstetric emergencies. The narrative centers on Teodora Vásquez, who was in the ninth month of her second pregnancy when she fainted and suffered a stillbirth. When she woke up at the hospital, she was accused of murder and was sentenced to thirty years in prison for aggravated homicide. At Ilopango Women's Prison, she becomes the spokesperson for The Seventeen, a group of working-class women who were all incarcerated after having miscarriages. Many of these same women became pregnant after being sexually assaulted. While it exposes brutal human rights abuses, the film is unmistakably a story of collective resistance, activism, sisterhood, as well as women's agency.





The beginning of her son's questioning and transition process coincides with a legal-parliamentary coup that, by means of an impeachment, removed former President Dilma Rousseff of Brazil from power. Thus, the period in which the film was produced is marked by a conservative breakthrough, an authoritarian upsurge and great oppression of minorities, taken as enemies by President Jair Bolsonaro.







Note of Intention

When I returned to Costa Rica after living more than 10 years abroad, I felt broken. I came back, because one of those fissures was the relationship with my father. Costa Rica represented a forgotten relationship, full of silences, and resentments. During the first months of my return, I met Ifigenia. She is an archaeologist specialized in stone spheres, the great archeological enigma of the country. I started reading her blog "The Drama of the Spheres" and found a character that approaches objects from a very interesting and sensitive perspective. Iphigenia talks, in a certain way, with objects. For her, objects are alive. I traveled with Ifigenia to the south of Costa Rica, where the spheres are located. I discovered a forgotten region of the country. A few months after that my father was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. When we were filming the documentary, my father entered the terminal phase of the disease, so the film was imprinted with his death.
