## What should I know to submit a proposal for LASA2026?

Online Submission Deadline: September 9, 2025, 17:00 hrs, ET.

Individual	The presentations in LASA2026 are sessions. Therefore, it is better if you find colleagues who would like to present papers with the same topic as yours and build a panel. Otherwise the track chairs will decide how to group together the different individual proposals based on similar themes.
	If you are interested in finding similar papers, check if others in your field are submitting individual proposals: <u>https://members.lasaweb.org/prot/papermatch/</u> . You can also upload your own information in order to be found by other colleagues. If you still want to submit as an individual, you will need:
	1. Paper title (no longer than 25 words and with mixed case) such as: "Let's be happy".
	2. Paper abstract (no longer than 250 words).
	3. Your co-author's last name (and first name) as it appears in LASA's records. You can search for individuals here: <u>https://members.lasaweb.org/prot/mdsearch/</u> (If not sure, search partial last names such as "Hernan" for Hernández). <b>Make sure the</b> <b>correct person is selected. Confirm their affiliation.</b>
Panel	1. Panel title (no longer than 25 words with mixed case) such as: "Let's be happy".
Farici	2. Panel abstract (no longer than 250 words).
	3. A minimum of three and a maximum of five papers. (You can submit the panel with three papers and then edit it as needed until the deadline).
	4. At least one session organizer (maximum two), one chair (maximum two) and a discussant (not mandatory but highly recommended).
	5. You will also need the following information from the paper presenters:
	a. Paper title (no longer than 25 words and with mixed case) such as: "Let's be happy". b. Paper abstract (no longer than 250 words).
	c. Author's last name (and first name) as it appears in LASA's records. You can search for it here: <u>https://members.lasaweb.org/prot/mdsearch/</u> (If you are unsure, search partial last names such as "Hernan" for Hernández). <b>Make sure the correct</b> <b>person is selected. Confirm their affiliation.</b>
	6. You should know the last name (and first name) of chairs, organizers and discussant as they appear in LASA's records (follow the same instructions for the presenters).

Workshop or	1. Workshop or roundtable title (no longer than 25 words and with mixed case) such as: "Let's be happy".
Roundtable	2. Workshop or roundtable abstract (no longer than 250 words).
	3. A minimum of three (there is no maximum). (You can submit it with three presentations and then edit it as needed until the deadline).
	4. At least one session organizer (maximum two), one chair (maximum two) and a discussant (not mandatory but highly recommended).
	5. The participant's (presenters, session organizers, chairs, and discussant) last name (and first name) as it appears in LASA's records. You can search for it here: <u>https://members.lasaweb.org/prot/mdsearch/</u> (If you are unsure, search partial last names such as "Hernan" for Hernández). <b>Make sure the correct person is selected.</b> <b>Confirm their affiliation.</b>
Travel Grant	1. To apply for a travel grant, you must first submit an individual paper proposal or be part of a panel proposal. Only accepted proposals will be eligible for travel grant consideration.
